

DMCA takedown notice

The following email was received by Wikispooks on 7 September 2016

Greetings:

My name is Sharon Casteel and I am the Digital Publishing Manager of the University of Texas Press. A website that your company hosts (according to WHOIS information) is infringing on at least one copyright owned by my company.

We have exclusive digital rights to the following material:

Conspiracy Theory in America, BY Lance deHaven-Smith; Copyright © 2013

These exclusive rights are being violated by material available upon your site at the following URL:

https://wikispooks.com/wiki/file:Beyond_Conspiracy_Theory.pdf

This letter is official notification under Section 512(c) of the Digital Millennium Copyright Act ("DMCA"), and I seek the removal of the aforementioned infringing material from your servers. I request that you immediately notify the infringer of this notice and inform them of their duty to remove the infringing material immediately, and notify them to cease any further posting of infringing material to your server in the future.

Please also be advised that law requires you, as a service provider, to remove or disable access to the infringing materials upon receiving this notice. Under US law a service provider, such as yourself, enjoys immunity from a copyright lawsuit provided that you act with deliberate speed to investigate and rectify ongoing copyright infringement. If service providers do not investigate and remove or disable the infringing material this immunity is lost. Therefore, in order for you to remain immune from a copyright infringement action you will need to investigate and ultimately remove or otherwise disable the infringing material from your servers with all due speed should the direct infringer, your client, not comply immediately.

I am providing this notice in good faith and with the reasonable belief that use of the material in the manner complained of is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law. Under penalty of perjury I certify that the information contained in the notification is both true and accurate, and that the Press the authority to act on behalf of the owner of the copyright(s) involved.
